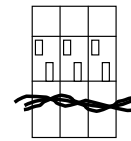

Nominations for Honorary Posts and Committee Members for both Organisations must reach the appropriate Secretaries by 15th May 2007.

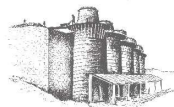


VOLUNTEERS.
