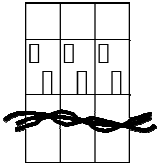

## Village Play Areas

You may be aware we have a small play area for 0-4 year olds behind The Village Hall and a larger one suitable for 4-12 year olds at Buttons Place but did you know there is a playing field behind Hedley Hill Terrace? It is a huge area with 3 very old pieces of play equipment. Waterhouses Community Association is working with the City Council to improve it and make it a play area suitable for 9yrs onwards.

Our project is divided into three parts;

1. Make part of the area into a wildlife meadow with an information board of what to find and where.
2. Replace the old play equipment with exciting and challenging new apparatus and a picnic area.
3. Create a circular walk around the village pointing out places of interest and including the picnic/play area.

The council has agreed to the meadow area and they will manage it, however the play area can only be accomplished if funding is found by us and the council agree to "take it over" once it is installed. As yet they are reluctant to commit themselves and are awaiting the time when the new Unitary Council can make the decision. In order to be prepared for that time we would like to know what type of play equipment young persons from 9 years old would prefer.
